The holidays always propose a challenge to the members of the HOPE Group. While it is difficult during this time to communicate your feelings, it is important that you do so. Sometimes it is easier to write a letter, taking time to describe what your wishes for the holiday to be. The following idea for a letter to family and friends could be used either in its entirety or just in part to your own family and friends. It is written looking for understanding during the holidays but could be modified for use at any time of the year.

Dear Family and Friends:

Thank you for not expecting too much from us this holiday season. The absence of our child when the "whole family" gathers seems to accentuate our incomplete family. It is difficult to cope with the "spirit" of the holidays on the radio, TV, in the newspapers and stores. We will need the patience and understanding of our family and friends to help us through the holidays as best we can.

Our family traditions may be too painful for us to continue this year. We may want to change the way we spend Thanksgiving, Christmas, or Hanukkah. Please understand this and maybe some time in the future we will have these traditions again. Whatever our thoughts are for coping with the day, please take our feelings into consideration when you make your plans.

Please allow us to talk about our child, if we feel a need. Perhaps the single most helpful thing you can do for us is to include our child in the holidays. We want to hear his/her name, to have you recall memories of their brief life, to know that you, too, are feeling their absence and remembering them with love.

As we work through our grief, we will need your patience and support, especially during these holiday times and the "special" days throughout the year.

Thank you for not expecting too much from us this holiday season.

The few times I have been in their presence, I have always felt that it made no difference who you are, everyone was hurting and was the same. No one looked down on you as you grieved. AN ACT OF LOVE FOR MY SON
A HOPE PERSONAL STORY by Rindy Huebner



Happy Birthday Mark and Happy Anniversary HOPE. Unbelievably, it will be twenty five years this November 10th that our precious son, Mark Edward Huebner, was born still. A few months later, with the help of Winchester Hospital Social Services, Pam Bureau and I formed the HOPE Group.

A few years before Mark was born, my husband and I tried unsuccessfully to have a baby. Tests for infertility were few, but there seemed to be no reason why I couldn't conceive. Soon I suffered an ectopic pregnancy and we decided to look into adoption.

Three months later I found I was pregnant again. I had an uneventful and happy pregnancy. The time flew by but during an ultrasound at 40 weeks, our balloon was burst with the words "no fetal heartbeat". I delivered Mark vaginally but never saw him. I will always remember one nurse coming to my room and telling me that I had a perfectly formed, beautiful son. I never saw my baby so I cherish those words. We insisted on a service and the only memory I have of Mark is the small white casket covered with yellow roses.

My doctor said that all the tests were negative so the conclusion was a "cord accident". We did decide to stay with the same doctor as he was very supportive. I knew he would treat any sub-

sequent pregnancy at high risk. The next two months were a fog. I barely got out of bed. I was fortunate to have supportive friends and family but I needed to talk to someone who shared my feelings. I attended a HOPE Group meeting on the South Shore and realized the need for a group in our area. So with much help and support our HOPE Group started. Many people ask me why I still stay with the group. It is an act of love for my son; love I could never physically give Mark. I hope that the pain of others can be eased through the support of parents who have survived the loss of a baby.

Mark will always be in our hearts. We remember him as the first son, grandson, nephew, and brother in our family. His sister, our precious Karen Alissa, was born less than a year later. I attended many meetings during that stressful nine months and my HOPE friends supported me all the way. Although we have our beautiful daughter here, not a day goes by that I don't remember my son in some way. I cherish every friend I have met through HOPE. I wish none of us had to lose a baby to become a member but our bond is strong and forever. The HOPE Group is one positive ripple in my life that came from Mark's death.

Whether 25 days or 25 years have passed, the pain remains. It becomes less intense but the emptiness in your heart remains. I hope you can find positive ways to fill your "heartache emptiness". Our group has helped heal my heart. As I celebrate Mark's birthday and HOPE's anniversary, I think of all our members...too many over the years. I send you hugs, love, and peace. Rindy

MY MISSING PIECE

Sixty-two years I have been searching for my missing piece.

At 21 they told me it was for the best. I tried so hard to believe. At 21 I cried and they told me I should pull myself together. I tried so hard to believe. I tried so hard to stop. At 21 they told me there would be other children. I tried so hard to see it their way. At 21, along I went on as if nothing had happened.

At 26 there were no more children. They said, "See , everything is wonderful". I say yes, and it was, but my piece was still missing. Secretly, I thought I must be a bad mother. I should be happier. And so life went. A creeping sadness I couldn't shake.

Sixty-two years I waited for someone to ask and say, "How hard for you". Someone said it and the missing piece has been found, reborn. My baby, my child, my dreams. You were my first step into believing in the future. You, my child, my missing piece. So many years I was isolated from you and myself.

Now my pain is clean. I still don't know WHY but I know I have a right to grieve. And remember, and acknowledge what you mean and meant to me. Strange, now at 83 I truly feel like I can go on.


HOPE
